

# ***BUDE CANAL 1904***

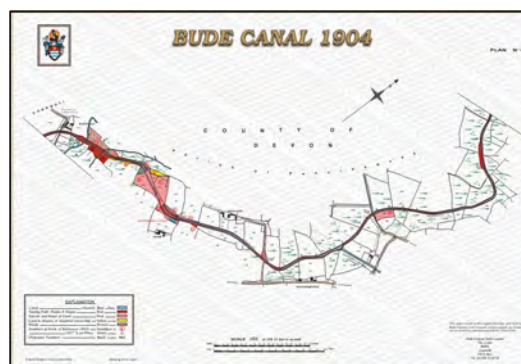
## ***Plan No 6***

***The Tub Boat Canal Section &  
Aqueduct (Feeder Arm)  
Burmsdon Farm to Dunsdon***



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From left to right, the canal runs northwards from Burmsdon Farm where there is an aqueduct carrying the canal over the River Tamar into the Parish of Pancrasweek in Devon. The next main feature is the Vealand Inclined Plane and the Water Treatment Works for Bude and Stratton. The works were built following the closure of the canal around 1900. Continuing northwards the canal divides at Highermoor, one branch going eastwards to Holsworthy and the other continuing as the 'feeder arm' to the Alfordisworthy Reservoir (now known as Lower Tamar Lake). The final feature is Brendon Bridge.
